Transition Times is a biweekly publication of UCSF Stanford Health Care. The goal is to provide quick, timely updates on current activities, decisions and plans for the employees and physicians working at UCSF Stanford Health Care facilities.

Prizes Offered for Referring Friends

A new program to encourage employees to refer their friends for hard-to-fill jobs at UCSF Stanford will be launched by early May. In initiating the employee referral program, human resources recognizes the critical role employees can play in bringing good people to UCSF Stanford. Employees know their jobs and what the organization expects better than anyone, making them excellent screeners and recruiters. The program theme, "Hot Tickets," offers a number of incentives to employees. For each referral who is interviewed, an employee receives a choice of one of three prizes. For each referral hired, the employee receives a \$2,000 bonus (paid in three installments). Every three months, the names of employees who referred people hired by the organization go into a drawing for additional prizes of tickets to local shows and events - hot tickets!

Among other classifications, jobs eligible for the program include nurses, pharmacists and a number of information technology positions. A complete list of eligible jobs will be distributed when the program starts, along with posters, fliers and "tickets" to fill out to refer your friends to UCSF Stanford.

Managing Your Money

Borrowing from your tax-deferred annuity plan

Effective April 1, employees may borrow up to 50 percent of their account balance from their UCSF Stanford Health Care Tax Deferred Annuity (TDA) Plans. Employees may take loans from accounts they have either at TIAA-CREF, Fidelity or at both. The minimum loan is \$1,000 and the combined maximum loan from both TIAA-CREF and Fidelity is \$50,000. Loan repayment periods range from a minimum of 1 year to a maximum of 5 years (10 years if the loan is for the purchase of a primary residence). For information on interest rates, loan fees, early payoff, or to apply for a loan, call your TDA investment company: TIAA-CREF: 800-842-2776; Fidelity: 800-343-0860. Hardship withdrawals are also available from accounts at TIAA-CREF and Fidelity. For more information, contact your investment company.

Transferring money from prior plans to UCSF Stanford plans

After April 1, employees may request to transfer their account balance currently invested under the LPCH, SHS or UCSF tax-deferred annuity plans to their UCSF Stanford TDA account. Employees with 403(b) plans from other employers may also transfer these account balances to their UCSF Stanford TDA plans.

Before transferring money, call the vendor currently managing your account to obtain information about penalties or "surrender fees" that may be charged for the transfer of your funds. To transfer your money, call the investment company you selected for your UCSF Stanford account (TIAA-CREF or Fidelity). They will send you a form to initiate the transfer and provide you with details on what plans can and cannot be transferred. (TIAA-CREF: 800-842-2776; Fidelity: 800-248-4213 ext.3411).

Changing investment companies

Employees wishing to change investment companies for their TDA accounts may do so after April 1. To change companies for existing account balances (transferring balances), call the new investment company you would like to use. To change investment companies for future contributions, submit a change form in the human resources/benefits office at your site.

Investment companies to mail beneficiary forms

In April, you will be contacted by your TDA investment company to complete their beneficiary designation forms. You will be asked to designate a beneficiary for both the TDA and retirement plans by filling out two separate forms, unless you have already done so.
